	Revise last week's sight words by saying each word three times. Ask your parent/carer to introduce the sight words for the week by looking and saying each one three times. Shuffle and repeat. Complete the <i>"mother"</i> sight word worksheet (Bee, Bee Bumblebee worksheet). Read, write, clap, colour, trace, spell, find, tell and complete the sentence for the word <i>"mother"</i> . OR practise writing the word <i>"mother"</i> on a piece of paper or whiteboard. Then practise writing the sentence <i>"The mother is holding her baby."</i> Now clap the word <i>"mother"</i> , how many syllables/parts does it have? Complete worksheet <i>Word</i> <i>Family Fun - ag.</i> Read, write and colour the matching picture for each 'ag' word. Then find the list of 'ag' words	Practise your sight words from this term by saying each word three times. Shuffle and repeat. Complete the <i>"have"</i> sight word worksheet. Trace, write and find the word <i>"have"</i> . OR practise writing the word <i>"have"</i> on a piece of paper or whiteboard. Then practise writing the sentence <i>"I have a flower for my friend."</i> Cut out 4 small pieces of paper, write each letter in <i>"have"</i> on each piece (i.e. h on one, a on another, v on another and e on another). Shuffle the letters and then put them in the correct order to spell <i>"have"</i> . Repeat and see if you can do it faster. Complete worksheet <i>"eg"</i> <i>Apple Tree</i> . Cut out the apple words. Stretch and say each word. Glue the "eg" words on the tree and the "not-eg" words below the tree. Then practise writing the words. OR	Practise this week's sight words by saying each word three times. Find a book and see if you can find any of these words. Complete the <i>"help"</i> sight word worksheet. Trace, write, colour, find and draw a picture to match the sentence that uses the word <i>"help"</i> .OR practise writing the word <i>"help"</i> on a piece of paper or whiteboard. Now write <i>"help"</i> 10 times on a whiteboard or on a piece of paper as fast as you can! Complete worksheet <i>Word</i> <i>Family Read, Write &amp; Match! -</i> <i>ig.</i> Read, write and colour the matching picture for each 'ig' word. Then read the sentence and fill in the missing 'ig' words in the word search. Tick them off as you find them. OR Write as many <i>"ig"</i> words that you can think of. Write a sentence using one of	Practise this week's sight words by saying each word three times. Practise writing this week's words on a whiteboard, blackboard or a piece of paper. Can you write them without looking? Complete the <i>"father"</i> sight word worksheet (Bee, Bee Bumblebee worksheet). Read, write, clap, colour, trace, spell, find, tell and complete the sentence for the word <i>"father"</i> . OR practise writing the word <i>"father"</i> on a piece of paper or whiteboard. Then practise writing the sentence <i>"My father made me a sandwich for lunch."</i> Complete worksheet <i>Is it ag, eg, ig, og or ug?</i> Cut out the word family words at the bottom of the page, stretch and say each word and then glue it under the matching picture. OR Write as many <i>"ag, eg, ig, og</i> and <i>ug"</i> words that you can think of. Write a	Practise this week's sight words by saying each word three times. Play <i>Leap Frog</i> with your sight word cards. Choose 10 sight word cards, lay them face up on the floor, then leap like a frog to each word and say each word as you leap to it. You can make frog noises as you leap if you like ribbit! Complete the <i>Colour by Sight</i> <i>Words</i> worksheet. Complete worksheet <i>ag, eg,</i> <i>ig, og or ug?</i> Cut out the ag, eg, ig, og or ug words, stretch and say each word and then glue them next to the matching picture. OR Ask your parent/carer to say some " <i>ag,</i> <i>eg, ig, og or ug"</i> words to you one at a time. Stretch and listen for the sounds as you write each word on a piece of paper. Choose one of the words and write it in a sentence. Make some " <i>ag, eg, ig, og</i> or

	in the word search. Tick them off as you find them. OR Write as many "ag" words that you can think of. Write a sentence using one of the words. For fun - choose 3 "ag" words and say them ten times fast! Make and read your little information book Mary had a Little Lamb. How many words can you read on the last page? OR Make your own story called Mary had a Little Lamb. You can choose to decide what happens in your story and then draw some pictures to match. Read a text from your PM readers online.	Write as many "eg" words that you can think of. Write a sentence using one of the words. Play memory - Choose 5 "eg" words and play a game of memory (remember you'll need each word written on two different cards to be able to match them). Complete the handwriting worksheet – Lambs. Make sure you trace the dotted letter/sound/word carefully and then have a go writing them on your own. OR on a piece of paper, using textas, crayons, pens or pencils, practise writing the letters for the sound "I" (I for lizard). Remember to start at the top for each letter.
