The following schedule is based on the work provided to kindergarten students on a regular day at school. Links to online material have been included but do not necessarily need to be completed. Highlighted activities have been included as suggestions for students who do not have access to a printer. We understand that the completion of this amount of work may not always be achievable and stress that this is simply a guide of what **can** be done.

Morning	<p><b>English</b></p> <p>Revise last week's sight words by saying each word three times.</p> <p>Ask your parent/carer to introduce the sight words for the week by looking and saying each one three times. Shuffle and repeat.</p> <p>Complete the "soon" sight word worksheet (Sight Word Detectives worksheet). Read, trace, fill in the boxes, write, decorate, circle, colour the letters, find, and fill in the missing letters for the word "soon". OR practise writing the word "soon" on a piece of paper or whiteboard. Then practise writing the sentence "Soon it will be playtime." Cut out 4 small pieces of paper, write each letter in "soon" on each piece. Shuffle the letters and then put them in the correct order to spell "soon". Repeat and see if you can do it faster.</p>	<p><b>English</b></p> <p>Practise your sight words from this term by saying each word three times. Shuffle and repeat.</p> <p>Complete the "talk" sight word worksheet (Super Start Sight Words). Read, trace, colour, write, highlight, fill in the missing letters and write it in a sentence. OR practise writing the word "talk" on a piece of paper or whiteboard. Then practise writing the sentence "I can talk to my dog". Now clap the word "talk", how many syllables/parts does it have?</p> <p>Complete worksheet <i>Ice Cream Word Families</i>. Cut out the ice cream scoop words. Then match the scoops by gluing them on top of the piece of pie with the same word family. The words all have the "ab, eb, ob, ub" word family in them. OR Ask your parent/carer to say some "ab, eb, ib, ob or ub" words to you</p>	<p><b>English</b></p> <p>Practise this week's sight words by saying each word three times. Find a book and see if you can find any of these words.</p> <p>Complete the "could" sight word worksheet (Bee, Bee Bumblebee worksheet). Read, write, clap, colour, trace, spell, find, tell and complete the sentence for the word "could". OR practise writing the word "could" on a piece of paper or whiteboard. Then practise writing the sentence "I could hear the birds singing yesterday." Now play a game of <i>Stepping Stones</i> with your sight words from this week and last week.</p> <p>Complete worksheet <i>Word Family Read, Write &amp; Match!</i> - ib. Read, write and colour the matching picture for each 'ib' word. Then read the sentence and fill in the missing 'ib' word. Lastly, find the list of 'ib' words in the word search.</p>	<p><b>English</b></p> <p>Practise this week's sight words by saying each word three times. Practise writing this week's words on a whiteboard, blackboard or a piece of paper. Can you write them without looking?</p> <p>Complete the "find" sight word worksheet. Trace, write, colour, find and draw a picture to match the sentence that uses the word "find". OR practise writing the word "find" on a piece of paper or whiteboard. Now write "find" 10 times on a whiteboard or on a piece of paper as fast as you can!</p> <p>Complete worksheet <i>Word Family Fun</i> - ob. Read, write and colour the matching picture for each 'ob' word. Then find the list of 'ob' words in the word search. Tick them off as you find them. OR Write as many "ob" words that you can think of. Write a sentence using one</p>	<p><b>English</b></p> <p>Practise this week's sight words by saying each word three times.</p> <p>Play <i>Find the Treasure</i> with your sight word cards. Choose 10 sight word cards, lay them face down and ask your parent/carer to hide a button under one of the words. Then turn each card over, say the sight word, until you find the treasure.</p> <p>Complete the <i>Colour by Sight Words</i> worksheet.</p> <p>Complete worksheet <i>Is it ab, eb, ib, ob or ub?</i> Cut out the word family words at the bottom of the page, stretch and say each word and then glue it under the matching picture. OR Ask your parent/carer to say some "ab, eb, ib, ob or ub" words to you one at a time. Stretch and listen for the sounds as you write each word on a piece of paper. Choose one of the</p>

	<p>Complete worksheet <i>Word Family Frog Fun!!</i> - <i>ab</i>. Find, unjumble, write and match the picture to the word for each 'ab' word. OR Write as many "ab" words that you can think of. Write a sentence using one of the words. <i>For fun</i> - choose 3 "ab" words and say them ten times fast!</p> <p>Make and read your little information book <i>The Three Billy Goats Gruff</i>. How many words can you read on the last page? OR Make your own story called <i>The Three Billy Goats Gruff</i>. You can choose to decide what happens in your story and then draw some pictures to match.</p> <p>Read a text from your PM readers online.</p>	<p>one at a time. Stretch and listen for the sounds as you write each word on a piece of paper. Choose one of the words and write it in a sentence.</p> <p>Complete the handwriting worksheet – <i>Kids</i>. Make sure you trace the dotted letter/sound/word carefully and then have a go writing them on your own. OR on a piece of paper, using textas, crayons, pens or pencils, practise writing the letters for the sound "k". Remember to start at the top for each letter.</p> <p>Read a text from your PM readers online.</p>	<p>Tick them off as you find them. OR Write as many "ib" words that you can think of. Write a sentence using one of the words. Play a game of <i>Treasure Hunt!</i> – Choose some "ib" words on some pieces of paper. Ask your parent/carer to hide them around the house or backyard and then go on a hunt to find the words! Don't forget to read the words as you find them.</p> <p>Complete the sentence sequencing cut and paste worksheet – "<i>Male goats are called bucks or billy goats.</i>"</p> <p>Complete <i>Label a Goat</i> writing worksheet. Label the parts of the goat by filling in the missing words from the word bank. Then use the word bank to help you write 2-3 sentences about goats.
