School Leadership

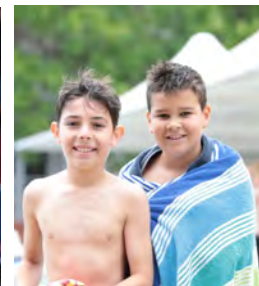

EARLY STAGE 1 KINDERGARTEN

The newest and littlest members of James Erskine Public School have started and are settling in beautifully to their new classes. It is wonderful to see all their smiling faces as they are standing quietly in their class lines each morning ready for their day to begin. A very big thankyou to all parents and caregivers for helping us by encouraging your child to hold their own bag while standing in lines by themselves and by waving good-bye and leaving them once the teacher arrives. They are looking so grown up.



Playground

Kindergarten have been practising how to walk in lines, lining up quietly and how to play with their friends respectfully. They have learnt where they are allowed to play and are now ready to start playing with the other children in the playground.

Library

Kindergarten have also been going to the library each week and have been introduced to a world of stories and some of our robotic friends. Borrowing has started and just a quick reminder that students will need a library bag to borrow a book from the library.

Crunch and Sip

Crunch and Sip has also started in our kindergarten classrooms. Crunch and Sip is a time for students to 'refuel' on fresh fruit or vegetables and 'rehydrate' with water. It has been shown that students who are not hungry and are well hydrated perform better in the classroom, show increased concentration, and are less likely to be irritable and disruptive.

Lateness/Attendance

It is important that students are not late to class as they can often miss vital information of what is happening. If your child is ever absent from school, it is important that a note is given to the class teacher as soon as your child returns to school.

Parent Helpers

Please see your child's class teacher if you are able to assist in the classroom. Remember to help in our classrooms all parents need to have their Working With Children Check. You are able to apply online through NSW Services.



Quick Reminders

- Please ensure that all students move up into the courtyard in the morning and not in the walkways as this is an out of bounds area.
- Please label all clothing and lunch items such as bottles and containers with their name and class.
- Make sure all students have their hats everyday so they can play in the playground.

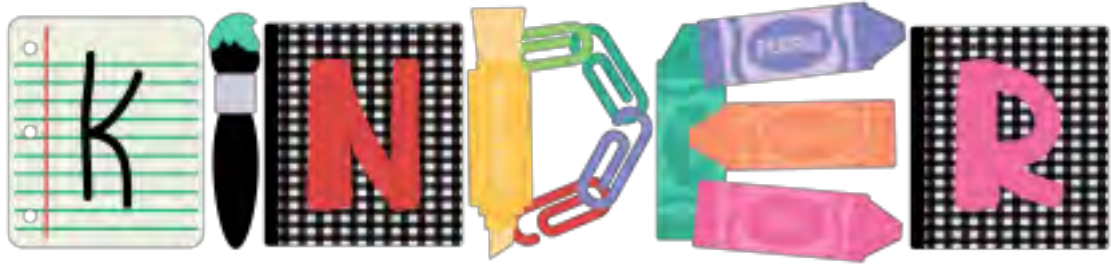
Our middle schools project continues this year with Year 5 going to the Erskine Park High for science lessons and Year 6 working with Year 7 in the area of P.E all year.
