Book / Education Week

We have decided to combine our Education week and Book week activities to week 6. The theme of Book week is 'Find your Treasure' and we have combined this theme with our school focus of writing to plan an exciting week.

Mrs Cattermole has collated lots of images for the classes to use as writing stimulus over the week. We have planned for authors to visit over the week and work with each class. Kinder, Year 1 and 2 will have Lesley Gibbes (Tuesday), Years 3 and 4 will work with Matt Cosgrove (Friday) and Years 5 and 6 with Tim Harris (Wednesday). Students will have the opportunity to purchase books by these authors and hopefully have them signed. We are hoping that they main take away will be to inspire our students as writers though there is also the opportunity for a great read and a keep sake that the students will always remember.

On Thursday 30th August we will have our Open day from 10:30 to 2:30. Students and teachers are encouraged to dress up in the 'Find your Treasure' theme. The P&C will host morning tea from 10:45/ 30. These tools may be useful to students diagnosed with ASD, along with students who experience anxiety, and students who sometimes find it difficult to focus.

NAPLAN ONLINE

This term, from Monday 20th to Friday 24th of August James Erskine students in Years 3 and 5 participated in the NAPLAN Online school readiness test. The school readiness test was a 'practice run' designed to help schools assess their technical and administrative readiness for the transition to NAPLAN Online.

This readiness trial was also opportunity for students to become familiar with the NAPLAN Online test format. It was not an assessment of student ability and there will be no reporting of student results

It is important to note that participation in the school readiness test has no effect on students' NAPLAN results from the paper-based tests students sat in May.

Speech and language skills for school aged children

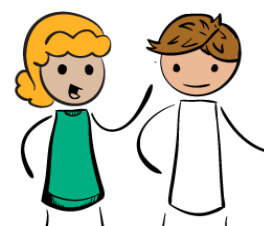
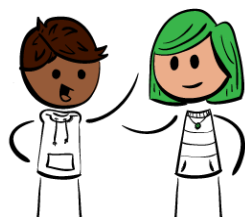
Would you like to know more about the development of communication skills in your children?

Term 3 Disco

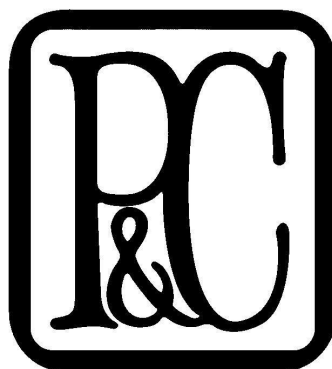

Stage 2 News

What a busy start to the term Stage 2 have had! The students are to be commended on their enthusiastic participation and good behaviour during all these events. Some new curriculum areas we will be covering this Semester

Child Protection

As in previous years, students will be involved in a series of child protection activities. The Stage 2 child protection units cover areas such as, identifying safe and unsafe situations, body parts, feelings and warning signals, protective strategies, seeking help and assertiveness.

Science

Year 3 *Feathers Fur and Leaves* - Students will explore how living things can be grouped on the basis of observable features and can be distinguished from non-living things. They will use this knowledge to investigate animal groups.

Year 4 *Beneath our Feet* - Students will explore how natural processes and human activity shape their surroundings. They will also investigate factors that affect the erosion of soils.

Geography

Places are Similar and Different - Students will examine natural and human features of Australia and the diverse characteristics of Australia's neighbouring countries. They explore the different climates, characteristics of places and use this information to imagine what it would be like to live in different places.

Interrelate Night

The Interrelate evening sessions have been postponed. A new date will be organised and information will follow. Session 1 - "Where Did I Come From?" is geared towards stage 2 students. In this session children learn more about how their bodies work and the differences between males and females.

Public Speaking Competition

It's public speaking time again! Students in stage 2 are required to deliver a 2 minute speech, focusing on voice projection, eye contact as well as getting as close to the correct time as possible.

The Year 3 topic is "**If I was a character, I'd be...**"

The Year 4 topic is "**If I could rule the world...**"

Selected students from class finals will then speak at grade finals and the winners will then move onto the school final. So start rehearsing, we are looking forward to some entertaining speeches.

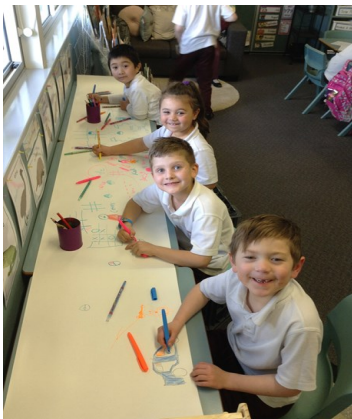
IB brought a touch of paradise to Week 2's Infants Assembly with their performance of You're Welcome from Moana.

In maths we have enjoyed making repeating patterns with our friends.

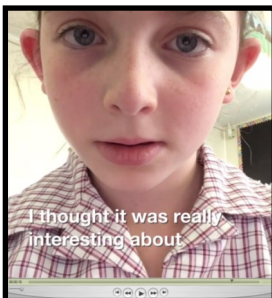
2R CLASS PROFILE

We are a class who love learning, thinking, questioning and investigating.

We love learning with Mystery Doug each week. We get to hear an interesting scientific question from a student somewhere around the world, talk about it and discuss our own ideas, find out the actual answer and then reflect on what we have learned.



This year we have used the iPads in lots of different ways. We have been practising how to record self-reflections of our learning, talking about what we learned, how we discovered it, how we feel about it and what we can do with our new knowledge. We also enjoy taking photos of our work and recording explanations of what we have created.



One of our favourite topics this year was learning about the history of Erskine Park. We learned about James Erskine and Andrew Thompson who were pioneers in the early days of Erskine Park. We also investigated the history of Mamre Homestead and nearby South Creek which was an Aboriginal meeting place of the Darug people.



This term in reading groups we have been reading for enjoyment, reading challenging texts, writing for enjoyment and writing a story about a particular picture or object. We have been learning strategies to make our writing more entertaining. Shortly we will be beginning to rehearse a storytelling performance that we will present to our class later in the term.
