## News from the Deputy Principal

### JEPS P & C

I would like to take this opportunity on behalf of the students and staff to thank the P&C for their work over the year. The P&C currently consists of 6 core members who have worked tirelessly for the students to raise money to support school projects and initiatives.

Over the year these 6 ladies have planned, coordinated, purchased, wrapped, sold, delivered, counted, communicated and tallied for; discos terms 1,2 and 3, Mother's Day and Father's Day stalls, a sausage sizzle, Open Day cakes and coffee stall, movie night, family photos and a shopping trip as well as running the school Uniform Shop.

At all times they have remained positive and eager whilst completing these events and assisting with anything else we ask of them as a school.

They have just donated \$50,000 to the school for iPads for the school so that every class can have one iPad between two students. As a school we are very grateful for the donation and for their efforts over the year.

Thank you to our wonderful P&C!

Next year we would like to move forward with having 2 representatives from each class so that we have a stronger representative body and the workload can be distributed. Early next year we will be looking at ways to implement this initiative though parents may like to attend the last P&C meeting of the year on Wednesday 21st November and join up then.

### School Behaviour System

I would like to congratulate the students who have received their gold certificates already this term and hope that over the next few weeks we have many more students reach this level in our school behaviour system. Congratulations to students who are trying each week and have achieved their best.

### Evacuation Procedures

Each term we hold an evacuation drill so that students are fully aware of evacuation procedures in the case of an emergency. Late last term we held an evacuation drill during play. While all students responded promptly there were a few issues which we hope we have now ironed out. Our drill gave us the opportunity to plan for routes students could take to reach our meeting place without congestion and incident. We were also then able to teach some points such as not stopping for drinks. In the next few weeks we will hold a Lockout drill. During this time we can test out our procedures and ensure all students are aware of the school's procedures.

### Attendance

Each term we acknowledge the students on the last day of term who have obtained 100% attendance. Now that winter is over we are hoping that more students will be able to receive this award. A reminder to parents that when students are away for whatever reason, whether that be illness, an appointment or a family event that we require a note within 7 days. Unfortunately after 7 days we can not enter our roll marking system and the absence is then recorded as unjustified. Multiple unjustified absences then require follow up from the class teacher and eventually the HSLO (Home School Liaison Officer) could be involved.

### Author Visits

On Tuesday we were fortunate enough to have authors and illustrators visit with students from Years 3 to 6. The students enjoyed hearing their stories and strategies for writing and illustrating. We thank parents for their support with this. We hope to continue to invite a range of authors to our school next year to widen the students exposure to literature and to provide motivation and skills that they can apply to their writing.

## **Interrelate Sessions**

Last Tuesday evening we held information sessions for students from years 3 to 6 around 'Where Do I Come From?' and 'Preparing For Puberty'. These talks were presented by Mel from Interrelate. While attendance at these sessions was small, the sessions were very informative, interactive for all attending and sensitively and respectfully presented.

Throughout the sessions some key points were;

- bodies change internally and externally and the importance of healthy foods and lots of water
- people are different and the changes they experience will be different and that's ok
- the importance of being responsible and making informed decisions
- feelings are ok, it's the way we express these feelings and ourselves that can cause problems
- the importance of talking to an adult was a reoccurring theme
- open communication between parent and child
- thinking and acting respectfully

## Shopping Trip



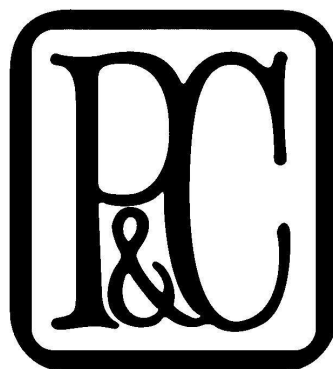

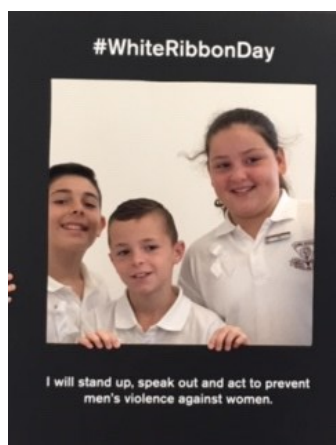


# White Ribbon

Last Friday representatives from all the STEPS schools gathered at St Clair High School for a morning tea to launch the events that will promote White Ribbon this month.

Students were joined by Tanya Davies MP, Member for Mulgoa , Mrs McSpeerin, our school director, school executive and white ribbon ambassadors.

Each school spoke up and pledged to support White Ribbon's campaign to stop violence and to promote respectful relationships. All STEPS schools have participated in the White Ribbon Breaking the Silence Schools Program and as such are all recognised as White Ribbon Schools.



This year White Ribbon Day will be held on Friday 23rd November to raise awareness and funds to support this important cause. As a community, we play a vital role in standing up, speaking out and ending all forms of violence.

At JEPS we will be holding a mufti day. We ask that the children wear black and white and bring a gold coin donation. This donation will be go towards supporting White Ribbon's national primary prevention campaign, which aims to stop violence before it occurs, through education initiatives in schools, workplaces and the broader community.

There is a national media campaign at present. Talk to your children about the ads on TV and in the print media. The alarming statistics for teachers is that on average, 1in 4 students are exposed to domestic family violence in their day to day life. 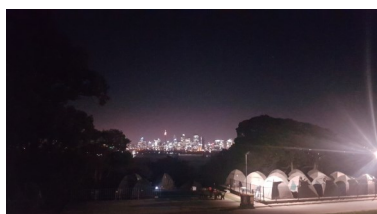
Bed time—well that's one word for it. As it was their first camp experience, let's just say they may have had a bit of a later bedtime than the usual time back home.
