I wanted to take this opportunity to bring to your attention some matters of concern that have come to light this term.....cyber safety and the recommended ages for use of social platforms.

Kindergarten Enrolments for 2020

Applications to enrol have commenced. If your child is turning 5 by 31 July 2020 they are eligible to enrol. For families residing in Erskine Park you can collect an enrolment package from the school office. If you reside outside of Erskine Park you may complete a 'non-local enrolment form'. The following documentation is required prior to enrolment - Evidence must = 100 points;



- Proof of residency – Property Contract, Lease Agreement, Rates Notice
- Utilities Bill – Water, Electricity etc
- Additional documentation – Telephone, Medicare Statement, Electoral Roll Registration etc

Student Documentation required (originals)

- Birth Certificate/Passport
- Immunisation Statement
- If applicable; court orders/health care/specialist reports

For cash/cheque payments please ensure all notes & money are placed in **one** envelope. To assist the office whilst receipting multiple cash/cheque payments for your child or children, it is preferred you place all children's payments in one envelope.

Medication for Students

If your child requires medication at school, it must be prescribed by a doctor. All medication must be presented to the school office and the parent/carer is required to complete a medication form. Please do not put any type of medication in your child/ren's bag as this poses a risk to all students. Even if this is a one –off medication, school procedures must still be adhered to. Your support in this matter is much appreciated.

Lost Property

End of term is nearing and we are constantly receiving lost clothing in the box that goes unclaimed. Please check the box for any missing items and ensure your child/ren's clothing is labelled so it may be returned to the classroom.

Sick Students Attending School

It's that time of year where there is a high volume of students presenting at the sick bay due to illness. While attendance is important, it is vital that sick children are kept at home to minimise the impact on the whole school and to aid their recovery.

During the last 2 weeks we have received multiple notifications from parents confirming that their child/ren have developed the following infectious illnesses;

Whooping Cough usually begins like a cold with a blocked or runny nose, tiredness, mild fever and a cough.

The cough gets worse and severe bouts of uncontrollable coughing can develop. Coughing bouts can be followed by vomiting, choking or taking a big gasping breath which causes a "whooping" sound. The cough can last for many weeks and can be worse at night.

Older children and adults may just have a cough that lasts for many weeks. They may not have the whoop.

Chickenpox (varicella) begins with a sudden onset of slight fever, runny nose, feeling generally unwell and a skin rash. The rash usually begins as small lumps that turn into blisters and then scabs. The rash appears over three to four days. At any one time, the lesions of the rash vary in stages of development.

Symptoms usually occur two weeks after exposure to the virus.

Persons who are previously vaccinated can still get chickenpox. If chickenpox occurs in a vaccinated person it is usually mild and less contagious than in an unvaccinated person .

Process – Student absences due to illness:

- If your child/ren are unwell please keep them home. Seek medical advice if you suspect their symptoms have worsened. If they contract a contagious illness that requires them to stay away for a designated period, **a clearance from the doctor will be required upon their return**
- Notify the school of your child/rens absence
- On your child/rens return to school, send an absence note to the classroom teacher as per the Department Attendance Policy;

4.1.2 Parents are required to explain the absences of their children from school promptly and within seven days to the school.

An explanation for absence must be provided to the school within 7 days of the first day of any period of absence.

Please take the time to check pencil cases over the holidays and replenish missing equipment such as glue sticks, white board markers, pens and pencils etc

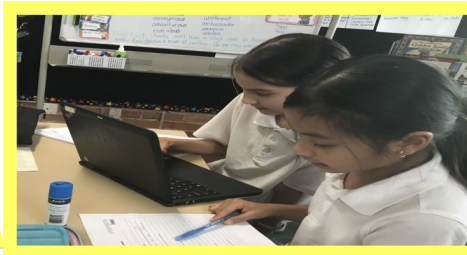

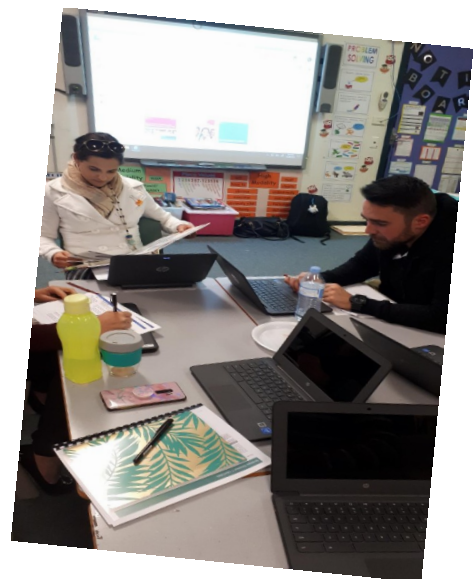
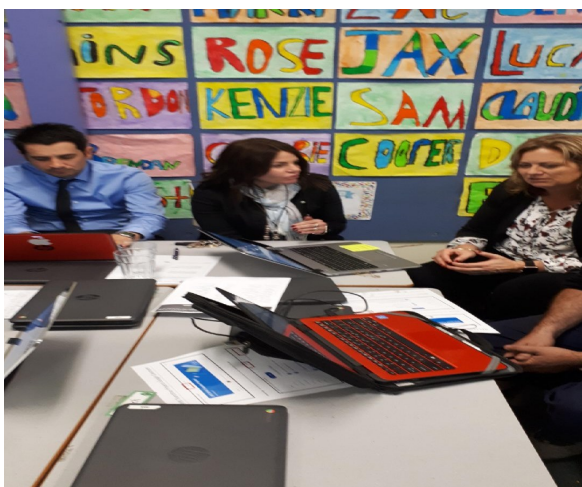
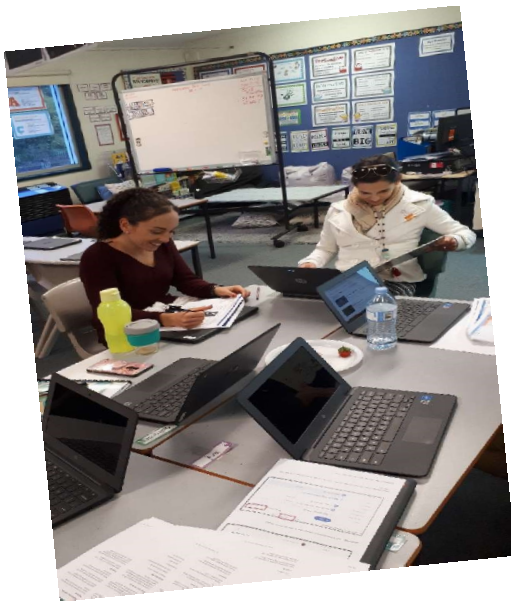


TRANSITION MEETING

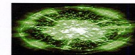

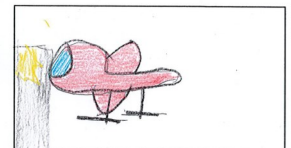

In New York on the 27th of June, people could not believe their eyes. A lady was hanging out of a helicopter on top of a tall building. The lady was known to be Lois Lane.

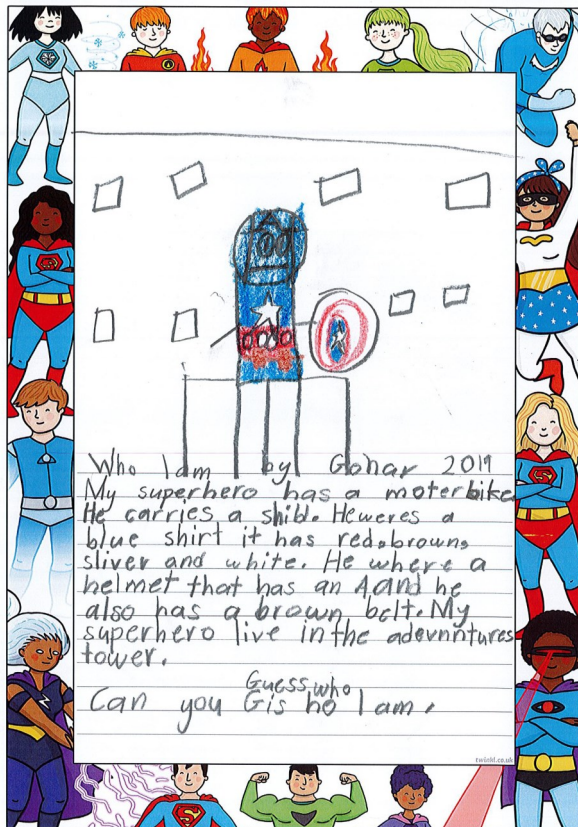

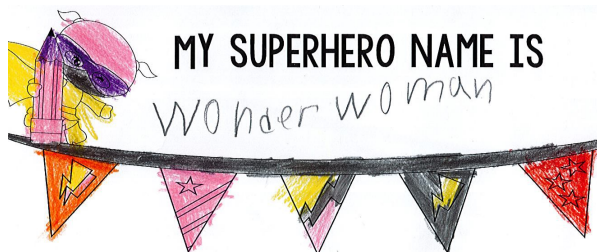

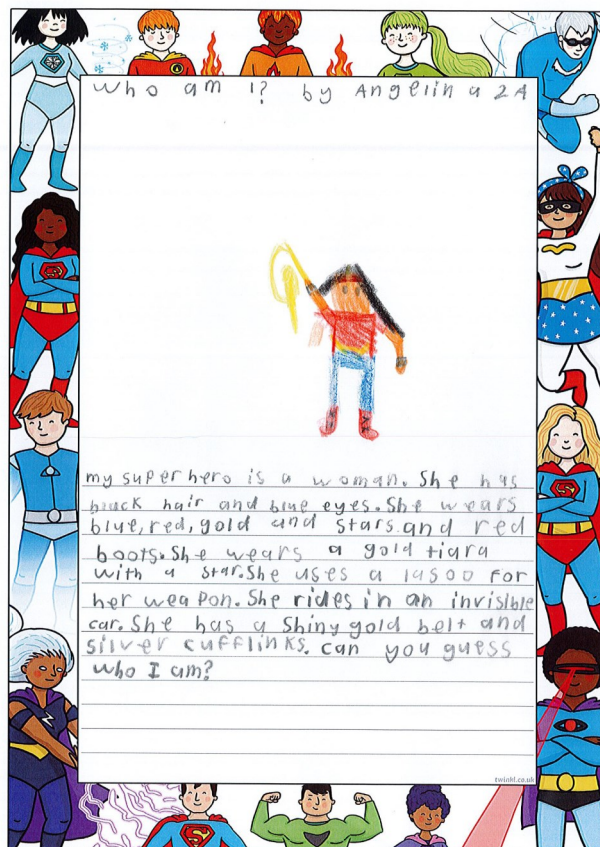

Wrap with Love

“Cold humanity is our concern, people caring about other people.”

Dear JEPS Families



“Wrap with Love” is a non-denominational, non-racial and non-political organisation. It relies on volunteers to knit or crochet a wool square. The squares are then sewn together to create a wrap to help people from Australia and all over the world stay warm.

This is one simple way to help people in need.

I am inviting all knitters and crafts people from the JEPS Community, to knit or crochet a wool square, to help make a knitted wrap, for people in need to stay warm.

Instructions for making the square

Squares for the wrap are to measure **25cm x 25cm**

- **Use 4mm needles**
- **8 ply wool yarn**
- **Cast on 50-55 stitches**
- **Knit in garter stitch.** No stocking stitch please (one row plain, one row purl) as the square will curl.

Completed wraps are made up of 28 squares.

I hope that crafts people from our JEPS community can contribute knitted squares. Let's see how many completed wraps we can achieve.

Please hand your squares into the school office or to Mrs Quinn by 1st August 2019. This will allow time for the squares to be sewn together. This is a joint project of our STEPS community, organized by Mrs Papasinos of St Clair Public School.
