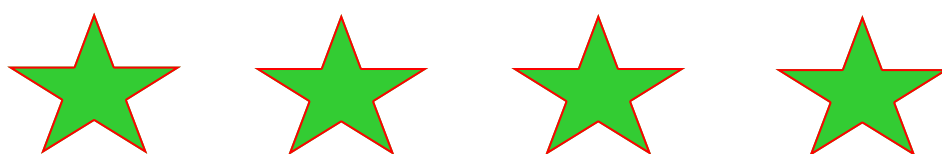

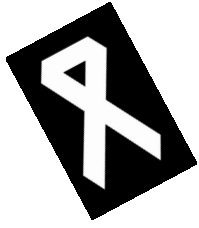
# BOXES OF KINDNESS

Well done Year 6 on a well-organised event. Your teachers are very proud of you.





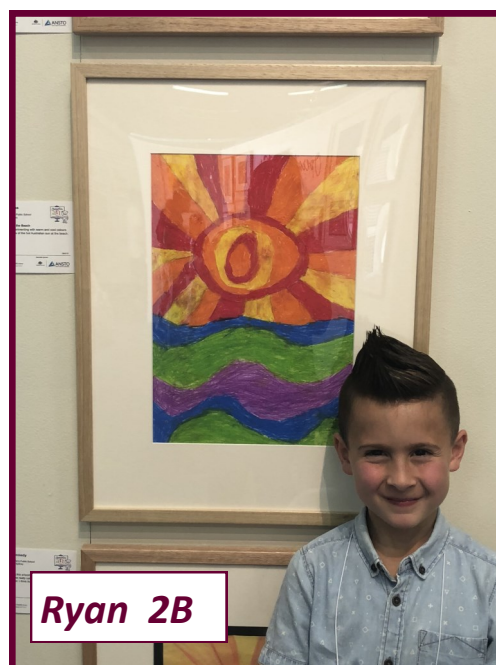

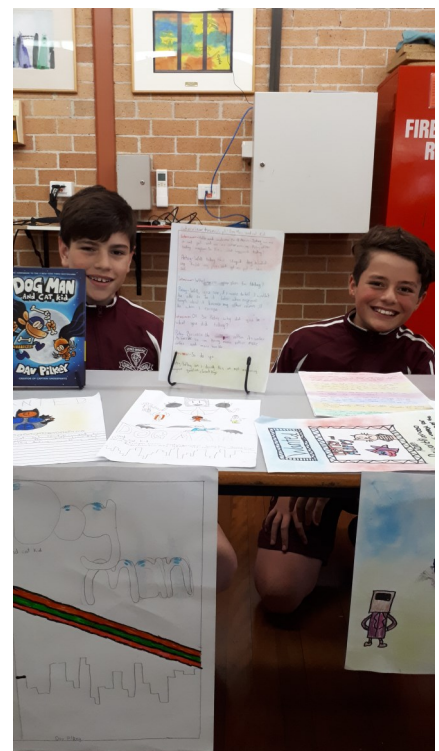


# Year 6 Fiction Frenzy at EPHS

# Year 6 to 7 Transition

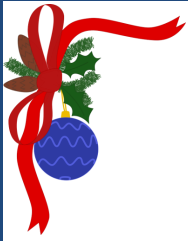

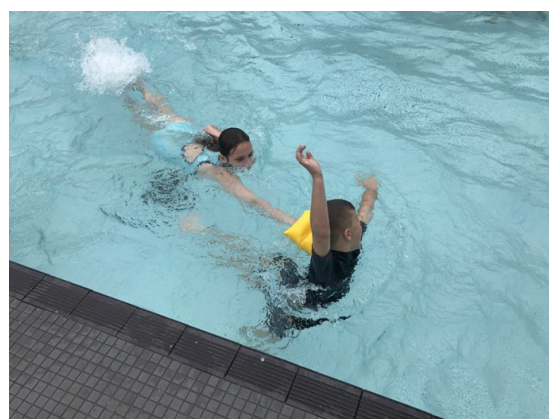




# SWIM SCHOOL

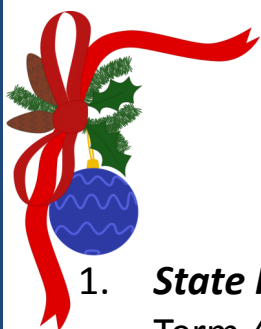
## Student Sporting Achievements cont.
